	and it is felt that the S106 is unfair and unreasonable and has outlived its purpose. Cllr			
	Finnimore asked if there is a record of any similar S106 Agreements being lifted; one near			
	Saltash has been lifted. Cllr White asked what Cornwall Council's policy is on lifting S106			
	Agreements and whether to do so could set a precedent.
